### DO YOU NEED HELP PAYING RENT?

The Legislature allocated \$8.4 million in March and an additional \$35 million in May to help individuals who are struggling to pay rent due to the financial impact of COVID-19. Additional funds were made available by the Federal CARES Act. Funds are distributed by local community action partners (CAP). You may be protected from eviction under legislation passed by the Oregon Legislature. An eviction moratorium is in effect until September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Please call 2-1-1 for more information.

### DO YOU NEED HELP PAYING YOUR MORTGAGE?

The Oregon Legislature recently released \$30 million in mortgage assistance. These funds are not yet available but will be accessible by mid-August. If you need or anticipate needing mortgage assistance, please sign up for the Oregon Housing and Community Services (OHCS) list serve for news about the program. If you need additional assistance, please contact your lender if you have not already. State and Federal laws require assistance when unable to pay due to COVID-19. You may be eligible for foreclosure protection through September 30<sup>th</sup> under recent legislation passed by the Oregon Legislature.
